Programme for guest lecturers

The scholarships are granted to experts and guest lecturers who will hold conferences, seminars, courses and workshops at Mexican universities and research institutions. The applicants must be specialists in their respective subject area and carry out an activity at a Slovenian university or research institution. Furthermore, they shall have a doctor's degree or be able to proof several years of lecturing. The teaching activity in Mexico must be more than four hours weekly. The stay in Mexico must last more than one and less than six months.

Residences for artistic-creative activities

The scholarships are granted for artistic-creative activities in Mexico which are supervised by a Mexican or foreign artist living in Mexico. The applicants must engage themselves exclusively in their artistic-creative activity during the stay in Mexico. The participation in courses or seminars is not provided hereby. The applicants can be artists, post-graduates or academics with demonstrated artistic experience in the respective area. The stay in Mexico must last more than one and less than six months.

Genaro-Estrada-Scholarships for Mexico-experts

The scholarships are granted to foreign experts who can demonstrate an extensive scientific activity as well as publications in areas concerning Mexico. The scholarships are granted for a research activity at universities, archives, libraries, research centres, etc. and its topic must be approved by a tutor from the selected institution. Applicants who want to begin with a research project in Mexico are not accepted. The stay in Mexico must last more than one and less than twelve months.

Scientific conferences

The scholarships are granted to foreign experts who will hold high-level conferences at Mexican scientific, research and cultural institutions. The applicants must be specialists in their respective subject areas, have a doctor's degree or be able to proof several years of lecturing and be invited by a Mexican scientific institution. The stay in Mexico must last more than one and less than four weeks.

Residences for information media staff

This programme aims at employees in active service for foreign print or electronic media who want to go to Mexico to do articles, documentations or interviews. At the end of his/her stay, the scholar must present a copy of the published document at the Department of Academic Exchange of the Mexican Foreign Ministry. The stay in Mexico must last more than one and less than four weeks.

Improvement of the quality of Mexican universities

The scholarships are granted to experts in the field of education and to managers in charge of internationalization of education. They shall offer lectures, courses, workshops and exchange experiences with their Mexican colleagues in order to contribute to the improvement of the quality, management, internationalization and administration of public higher education institutions in Mexico. The programme is not destined to carry out research activities. The stay in Mexico must last more than one and less than four weeks.
