Erasmus+ is the most frequently used and easiest possibility for cooperating with foreign universities and research institutions. 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## CEEPUS Exchange Programme

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CEEPUS (Central European Exchange Program for University Studies) is a multilateral regional program active since March 1995. The programme goal is to enable and encourage student and teacher mobility between the participating countries and to use the academic links and opportunities to form joint study programmes.

Current CEEPUS member countries are: Albania, Austria, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, the Czech Republic, Hungary, North Macedonia, Moldova, Montenegro, Poland, Romania, Serbia, the Slovak Republic and Slovenia. The Universities of Pristina, Prizren, Peja et al. are also participating.
